**Contact Your Legislators This Week As Education Budget Reaches  
Critical Stage and More Support Is Needed!**

**EDUCATION BUDGET IMPROVED BUT NOT YET ACCEPTABLE**

After several days of filibustering by Higher Education advocates, the Alabama House of Representatives passed a budget that unfairly cuts Higher Ed more severely than K-12 or the 2-year colleges. With tremendous help from legislators who stood tall for our campuses (see list below), the House-passed budget includes an increase of \$25 million over the Governor's budget for Higher Ed, which is a good step in the right direction. But we still have a long way to go!

As the session enters its final days, we are working hard to obtain an additional \$25 million in the Senate to meet critical funding needs and achieve parity with all of education. With only three legislative days left, the closing gavel will fall on Monday, May 19.

Much work remains to be done! On a vote of 55-32 last Thursday, the House tabled an amendment by **Rep. John Rogers** that would have added an additional \$25 million to Higher Ed's allocation in the House budget. As our full attention moves to the Senate, that is the amount we continue to work for.

**WHERE WE ARE NOW**

The House-passed budget bill allocates O&M funding for UA at \$176.18 million, a cut of \$22.18 million (11.2%). For UAB, O&M funding is \$311.27 million, a cut of \$41.73 million (11.8%). For UAH, O&M funding is \$51.74 million, a cut of \$6.36 million (10.94%).

In comparison, K-12 was cut only 2.9% and the 2-year colleges took only a 4.76% reduction.
